PRIORITIES

- Close the racial, gender, and economic opportunity gaps in our schools.
- Strengthen our upper schools (grades 6-8) with teacher collaboration, enhanced academic opportunity, and more arts, sports and extracurriculars.
- Emphasize learning and growth, not standardized tests.
- Ensure special education and advanced learning supports are accessible to all.

RESULTS

FREE UNIVERSAL PRESCHOOL

We are launching free universal preschool in fall 2024 for every 4-year-old and many 3-year-olds. I'm proud to have been a leader in getting the support and funding for programs and staff that will make this groundbreaking step successful.

INDIVIDUALIZED "CRADLE TO CAREER" SUPPORT

We are now building the coordinated system of support I advocated for, including Individualized Student Success Plans, mental health services, afterschool, college and career guidance, early college, internships, and apprenticeships. We must ensure that in our new system no child falls through the cracks or lacks support to reach their potential.

ALGEBRA 1 & THE SCIENCE OF READING

Throughout our curriculum, we must set the floor high – and we must not impose ceilings. I successfully pushed CPSD to establish equitable pathways to Algebra 1 for all before 9th grade, and to shift to science of reading-based early literacy instruction to make certain all of our children can read at grade level.

INCLUSIVE, SAFE SCHOOLS

I continued to speak out against intolerance in our schools, calling out racism, antisemitism, misogyny and homophobia; supported LGBTQIA+ students, faculty and staff; and updated our hate and bias-related incident policy.

ADDRESSING CLIMATE CHANGE

I was lead sponsor of the policy that committed us to a fully electric Cambridge school bus fleet by 2030, and will continue to push our schools to act boldly to address climate change.
